Scope

- ❑ Citation standards
- ❑ Analytical Methods Transparency
- ❑ Design and Analysis Transparency
- ❑ Preregistration of Analysis Plans
- ❑ Data Transparency
- ❑ Research Materials Transparency
- ❑ Preregistration of Studies
- ❑ Replication (not relevant here)

Scope

For each type of standard, set a priority for 3ie:

- High
- Medium
- Low

You may or may not want to give them all a high/low priority.

Scope

	High importance to 3ie	Low importance to 3ie
Easy to implement or convince (“Quick win”)	HIGH	MEDIUM
Hard to implement or convince	MEDIUM	LOW
